

→ INTRODUCTION

OVERVIEW







ARTogether's "Arts in Schools" program provides spaces where newcomer students feel safe to express themselves, have fun, and make friends. What began as a humble endeavor in 2019 with a music production class, has now blossomed into an arts education initiative encompassing visual art, dance, and music; we currently engage four schools in different capacities ages K-12.

The 2023/24 school year incorporated 5 larger youth art classes and 2 smaller workshops engaging 372 students for a total attendance of 2,021 across our programs. Most projects center around the two largest newcomer schools in the East Bay: Oakland International High School (OIHS) and Fremont High School in East Oakland, with additional growth this year in Contra Costa and students of expanded age ranges.

When students arrive in the U.S., they are thrown into a challenging environment that often lacks essential support. Art projects, songs, and dances rooted in the experiences of our students helps them to value themselves and their cultures, and sends a very strong message: Here we can share our cultures, we can grow, and we can celebrate our differences together. It is important to model multicultural ideas into any classroom. For newcomer classrooms especially, these are their first cues of self-acceptance and belonging in their new homes. Aligned with our partners, ARTogether has one true message for newcomer youth regardless of the creative medium: we see you, we're here for you, and you belong here.
















RE: Letter of Support for ARTogether
